I would like to thank all boaters who participated and exerted great effort in decorating their yachts. The winning boats donned spectacular decorations that delighted both the judges and attendees, and were truly deserving of the prizes. We also expanded the scale of the Sentosa Cove Holiday Market to include more than 20 food, game and gift stalls, as well as better entertainment such as roving acts, children's rides, giant bouncy inflatables, water games and more. And what is Christmas without gifts? Over the two-day event, we gave out more than 50 lucky draw prizes including stays at W Hotel, shopping vouchers and toys, among other attractive gifts. We are also happy to announce that renovation works on four



of our suite rooms—St Tropez, Portofino, Monte Carlo I and Monte Carlo II—have been completed. We hope that Members will enjoy the refreshed look of the suites, which was inspired by the sea and life on the water. The new vanity designs follow the same aesthetic language as the living and bedroom spaces, making for a harmonised, seamless look.

No sooner have we celebrated Christmas and New Year's Day than we find ourselves in the thick of preparations for Chinese New Year. This year, Members and their guests will be spoilt for choice with the many dining options on offer—from the reunion set menus and Chinese New Year goodies for takeaway at WOK°15 Kitchen to the Lunar New Year Buffet at LATITUDE Bistro. The second day involved 12 boats parading through the Marina towards Resorts World Sentosa, with judging taking place at Harbourfront Cruise Bay. Although the quality of the displays was exceptional all around, particular mention is owed to the Royal Albatross, a magnificent tall ship which is usually berthed at Resorts World Sentosa. The Royal Albatross made an elegant entrance into the judging bay and impressed the judges with her majesty and colourful lights.

While the festivities carried on at sea, on land a party was in full swing, with the Sentosa Cove Central Precinct transformed into a magnificent Christmas Market. More than 20 stalls with food,

games and gifts on offer added to the holiday cheer. Naturally, Santa Claus himself made an appearance, handing out sweets and balloons to all the boys and girls with a little help from two Santarinas. There were also stilt walkers dressed in Christmas costumes, an engaging bubbles performance and a Christmas Tree Light-up on each day of the event.

There was also a lucky draw on both days, and 30 winners took home attractive prizes including a stay at W Hotel and shopping vouchers. A poolside buffet and prize ceremony wrapped up the event for another year and signalled the end of a very merry weekend. 🎅

A LIFE LESS ORDINARY

Living on-board a 50-foot yacht is, for most, merely the stuff of dreams. And this couple lived the dream.

For Fintan and Jennifer Mc Kiernan, sailing is simply a way of life—for a while, quite literally. After two years living on Singapore's West Coast, in 2013 they joined ONE°15 Marina, bought a 50-foot yacht and moved on board. Thus began a five-year stint that sounds wildly romantic but was, at times, far from carefree.

"Maintaining a boat, particularly when you live on it, is hard work," says Fintan. "It is literally a never-ending process—and it is expensive. The bigger the boat, the higher the maintenance, so any notion that it might have been a relaxing existence went straight out the window!"

With both of them hailing from nautical families—Jennifer owned motorboats on Lake Michigan and Fintan has a boating business in Ireland—it certainly wasn't a surprise that their vessel required such vigilance. But the experience wasn't, well, plain sailing.

Regardless, the couple indulged in their joint passion, regularly sailing from Singapore to Malaysia and Indonesia—with, as Jennifer points out, the added benefit of never having to pack. They vividly recall a trip to Langkawi in which they found themselves accompanied by a school of around 100 dolphins, who seemed just as taken by Fintan and Jennifer as they were by them.

After five years of living on a boat, the Mc Kiernans decided to return to terra firma, selling their yacht and moving into an apartment not far from the marina. While they had both loved the experience of living at sea, they decided their boating days were over and a life on land seemed more sensible. However, a month later, Fintan was back on the water. "I think I must have been suffering some sort of land-sickness!" he laughs, recalling his brief boating hiatus. "I didn't even

last a full four weeks, maybe three. I just couldn't do it!"

So, the couple invested in a more manageable motorboat, and it is here that they now spend their free time. "I could have kept the boat out on a trailer," explains Fintan. "But my office is in Pasir Panjang and quite often, at 4 or 5 o'clock, I'll just decide to hit the water. It takes us 10 minutes to get going, and in no time at all we're sailing out to St John and Lazarus Island, and leaving it all behind. It just doesn't get better than that."

Although Fintan and Jennifer could be excused for wanting to preserve these little pieces of paradise for themselves, they are, on the contrary, absolutely delighted with the growing enthusiasm in sailing that they have witnessed in the seven years they've been in Singapore. "There is definitely an ever-increasing sense of appreciation for the sea, and that is truly fantastic," enthuses Fintan. "I think many people are realising that water leisure really opens up your horizons." For Jennifer, the allure of the sea is much simpler and all too obvious. "Once you walk through that little gate over there, you're on holiday," she smiles, pointing towards the harbour entrance. "You're only ever minutes away from total escape."

The camaraderie at the club is also a huge draw for the Mc Kiernans and they are the first to get involved in the numerous events on offer. The ONE15 Christmas Boat Light Parade™ is a particular highlight for them, with fellow boat owners engaged in some seriously fierce competition involving inflatable snowmen and stitching battery-operated LED lights into Santa hats. "Oh yes, we know who our competition is," chuckles Fintan. "But to be honest with you, most of our conversations are just about how to keep your boat afloat. Sailing—it's a real labour of love".

Fintan and Jennifer Mc Kiernan have been members of the Club for over five years, and it has become something of a second home to them.

THE Personal TOUCH

Getting to know one's clients is key to creating memorable events, says ONE°15 Marina's Catering Sales Manager Joanna Cheng.

Helping to make her clients' special occasions even more unforgettable is a speciality of Joanna's

LONGITUDE: Hi Joanna! Please tell us about your typical day here at ONE°15 Marina.

CATERING SALES MANAGER JOANNA

CHENG (JC): My typical day starts at 9am and ends whenever I am done! I handle all the enquiries for social events, whether it is a wedding, buffet or corporate occasion. Our busiest time of the year is usually pre-Christmas, although honestly, things are never quiet! We typically run two events every weekend, from Friday to Sunday, so no sooner has one celebration ended than we are working on the next. Most of my time is spent liaising with vendors, organising the catering, music and flowers, and making sure everything is ordered on time and nothing is forgotten.

Which specific parts of your job do you particularly enjoy?

JC: The best part of my job is getting to know our clients and helping them to create special memories. Most of the events we host are solemnisations or weddings, and quite often I meet the couple a year before their big day. This means we get to know one another very well, especially as we are discussing each and every element of an incredibly personal occasion. As we get closer to the event, I might meet our clients once or even twice a week. They would naturally feel more excited but also more nervous about what lies ahead, so I get to learn about how to reassure them, what helps them to feel relaxed, and how best to ensure that they enjoy the day of their dreams.

On the other hand, what are some of the challenges you usually face, and how do you overcome them?

JC: Whether it is a wedding or a corporate dinner, our clients do care a great deal about the event they are hosting with us. This can sometimes lead to frayed emotions, particularly if there are any unforeseen mishaps. Managing disappointments or misunderstandings is always difficult, but I find that being sincere, and finding a solution quickly, can smooth things out. Having a good dialogue with each of the teams involved in an event also means that hiccups can be avoided—speaking to the caterers, florists, musicians to make sure that they are all up to expectations.

You recently won a Gold National Kindness Award for notable services to our Members. How important is kindness in the workplace to you?

JC: I think kindness is important no matter where you are. One of the things I love the most about my job is that everybody gets along really well here at the Club. There was a lot of politics in my previous job for a big hotel chain, but that isn't the case here. Knowing that you have kind colleagues who are also friends makes coming to work so much more enjoyable.

What skills do you think are crucial to being a good assistant catering sales manager?

JC: You have to be organised. With so many events taking place at the same time, all the time, it is important to be able to work across several projects at once without letting any client down. Prioritising is essential as during peak season, it can get really difficult to know what to do first or who needs the most urgent attention. Communication is also key, whether it is between teams or with the client. By being open and sincere with your clients, you build trust, which is invaluable in making their event a success. 🎵

THE REUNION DINNER, REVISITED

These evergreen favourites aren't just delicious—
they represent a culinary legacy.

Singapore is a country of immigrants, with a sizeable population of Chinese whose forefathers came from China's southern provinces. The immigrants arriving from each province brought with them distinct dialects, cultures and customs of their various ancestries. All these ethnic groups shared certain festivals and events, each with its own unique celebratory practices. The biggest of these festivals is Chinese New Year, which heralds the arrival of spring. Traditionally, the celebration lasts more than 14 days and begins with the reunion dinner. Great effort is put into the preparation

of this meal, and each dish is carefully selected. Often, dishes that reflect the origins and values of each ethnic clan—the signature dishes—would be served at the reunion dinner.

However, with the rapid changes that are being brought about by urbanisation and globalisation, such age-old practices are slowly but surely disappearing from our society. In the following pages, we look closely at a number of disappearing dishes to highlight their significance in Chinese culture—some of these you may enjoy at WOK*15, which serves traditional and contemporary takes on Cantonese cuisine.

The Hakkas

The Hakkas were originally nomads from the northern regions of China. In historical times, they were uprooted from their homelands and moved south in four exoduses. The majority of the Hakkas eventually settled in the area around Guangzhou. They were a hardworking people who lived mostly in the hills. They ate what they sowed, and their food came mainly from the farms and ponds. Most Hakkas are frugal because of their historic past. Even during festive seasons, delicacies such as abalone and shark's fin are hardly seen on their dining tables. These traditional dishes offer an idea of the rustic lifestyle of the Hakka forefathers who arrived from China.



SALT-BAKED CHICKEN

Salt-baked chicken came from the days of the Hakka people's exodus. Meats were heavily preserved in salt so that their ancestors could eat them during their move from one place to another. In the past, the chicken was seasoned, wrapped in fresh lotus leaf, buried in coarse salt, and baked for an hour. The dish has since evolved—as lotus leaf is scarce these days, it has been replaced with baking paper. The Hakkas usually serve this dish during the festive season to remind themselves of their history.



YONG TAU FU

This dish evolved from northern China's traditional meat dumplings. As the Hakkas moved and settled in the south of China, they replaced the dumpling skin with tofu, which was more commonly available in the region. Later, as they continued to migrate to other places such as Taiwan and Southeast Asia, this delicacy became adapted to suit the local produce and taste buds. In this interpretation, soya bean and dried cuttlefish are used to add depth of flavour to the dish.

The Teochews

The Teochews lived by the sea, in a region sandwiched by Guangzhou and Fujian. Teochew cuisine is understated and greatly emphasises freshness of ingredients and subtle, multi-layered flavour combinations. However, luxury is not altogether excluded, as families would sometimes procure the most expensive ingredients, yet cook them using the simplest methods.



SEVEN-COLOURED VEGETABLES

The seventh day of the Chinese New Year is an important event for the Teochews as they believe it is a birthday celebrated for all mankind. To mark this special occasion, seven types of vegetables are carefully selected for their colour, shape and taste to be prepared and served during the reunion dinner. The choice of vegetables has been simplified, but Chinese leek is one crucial ingredient that has to be used, for it has a similar sound to ‘counting money’. The cooking method is simple—just quick-fry and serve immediately.



BRAISED ABALONE WITH SPINACH

The abalone is stewed in superior broth for many hours to soften its texture, after which it is decorated with wolfberries and served on a bed of blanched spinach. Some Teochew families make it a point to serve expensive delicacies during Chinese New Year. They believe that doing so would show that the family has done well in the past year, and would also hopefully continue their good fortune by eating sumptuously during this period.

The Hokkiens

The Hokkiens were the inhabitants of a fertile land, and their cuisine was very much influenced by the produce of this area. Hence rice, wheat, potatoes and yams were their dietary staples, while seafood and meat became supplementary ingredients. Hokkien cuisine is down-to-earth and uses whatever seasonal ingredients are available. The following dishes are commonly served during Chinese New Year.



HOKKIEN FRIED OYSTER OMELETTE

Hokkien fried oyster omelette is a more elaborate dish for the festive season. Unlike the Teochew-style variant that we commonly find at local hawker centres, this version consists of dried mushrooms, shredded carrots, bamboo shoots and oysters cooked in lard and tapioca flour.



BRAISED SEA CUCUMBER AND DUCK

The Chinese saying of “shan zhen hai wei” or “delicacies from both land and sea” is often used to describe a very generous meal filled with such ingredients. As such, the Hokkiens would pick dried sea cucumber and goose as a representation of these delicacies from land and sea. In Singapore, duck is used as substitute for goose meat.

The Cantonese

Canton (Guangdong) was a cosmopolitan city that attracted people from all over China, as well as foreigners (hence its periods of foreign occupation), to trade and make a living. As a result, Cantonese cuisine is complex, with influences coming from China and its colonial occupiers. Most dishes for the reunion dinner are either selected for their auspicious-sounding and poetic names or for their expensive ingredients.



POON CHOY

Poon Choy came from the Hakkas, where each family would contribute some food and all of it was combined in a huge bowl. It was then steamed and served throughout the day. There were many Hakkas living in Guangzhou and Hong Kong, so the Cantonese of the time adapted this dish to their cuisine. They also added expensive ingredients such as large prawns and abalone. With Poon Choy, there are no hard and fast rules—in fact, the dish tastes best when people just add whatever is left over from the festive celebration, and steam it for 30 minutes or so.



FRIED MIXED VEGETABLES

To some Cantonese Buddhists, Chinese New Year is also a time to show gratitude for blessings bestowed, signified by not killing animals. Hence, it is quite common to find a vegetarian dish on the reunion dinner menu. Ingredients such as dried shiitake mushrooms, cabbage, carrots, broccoli and cauliflower are often used. The Cantonese usually cook the vegetables with preserved red bean curd paste. In some families, this dish is prepared in huge portions and distributed to other families and friends as a token of generosity.

LION'S HEAD MEATBALLS (狮子头)

6 - 8 PORTIONS

INGREDIENTS

- 1 kg pork belly
- 300 g prawn meat
- 2 eggs
- 20 g chopped garlic
- 50 g white cabbage
- 30 g chopped water chestnuts
- Oil for deep frying

SEASONINGS

- 1 tbsp light soya sauce
- 2 tbsp Hua Diao wine
- 1 tbsp sesame oil
- 2 tbsp fish sauce
- 1 tbsp five-spice powder
- Salt and pepper to taste

METHOD

- Mince pork belly and chop prawn meat. Place minced pork belly and prawn meat into a whisking bowl.
- Add remaining ingredients and seasonings, mix well. Form into small balls.
- Heat up oil, deep-fry meatballs in hot oil until golden brown. Remove and drain. Serve with sweet and sour sauce.

Harbour Rocks Hotel

In fact, ensuring that guests leave feeling restored is so high on the hotel's priority list that there is even a pillow menu from which to choose, to guarantee the ultimate night's sleep.

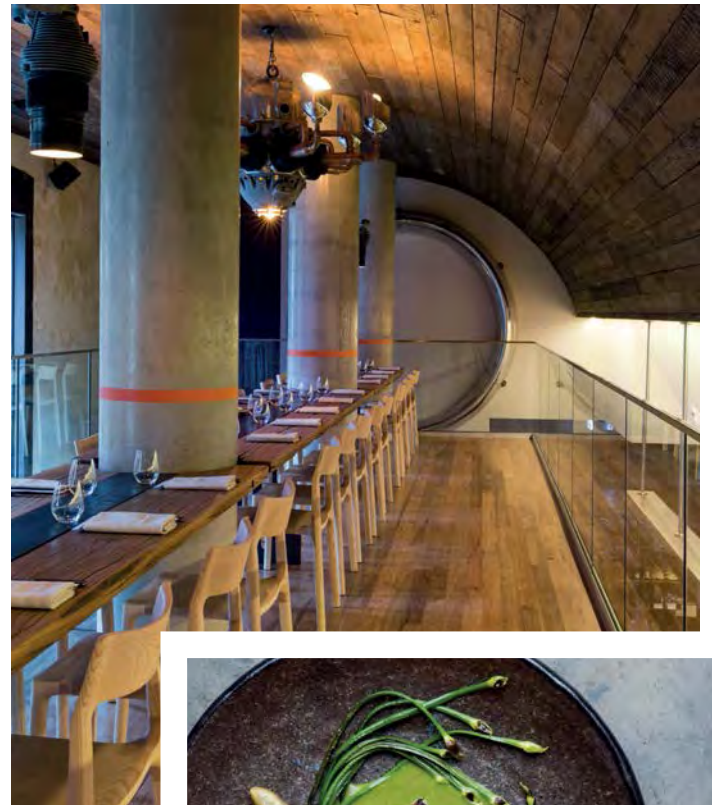
Harbour Rocks Hotel is a cosy oasis in the middle of Sydney's historical Rocks precinct.



The Old Clare

Set in the heart of trendy Chippendale, The Old Clare is one of Sydney's hottest hangouts, calling out to hipsters and hotel-connoisseurs alike. Vintage posters line the lobby walls, VW Beetle lights illuminate the lift shaft and there is even an onsite Gentleman's Barber. Home to not one or two but three of Sydney's best restaurants, it is a culinary destination in itself, but to boot it features 62 rooms that are each entirely unique. Discover neighbourhood eateries

Rather than heading to the latest city hotspot, make like the locals and adopt a laidback approach to your breakfast, lunch or dinner plans by taking a stroll through some of the more popular ‘foodie’ neighbourhoods. Potts Point, Chippendale, Surry Hills and Newtown are just some of the trendy areas serving up memorable meals at all times of the day, from smashed avocado on toast for brunch to sizzling surf ‘n’ turf for supper.

Work up an appetite with a bit of shopping on Macleay Street, home to Sydney’s edgiest fashion boutiques, or go for a jog around Prince Alfred Park—there is even an outdoor pool in which you can cool off. From squid, sea urchins and prawns to crayfish, giant lobsters and razor clams there is an endless variety of exotic seafood to choose from, but if it is a simple fillet of sole or a tuna steak you are after then there are plenty of uncomplicated delicacies as well, all of which can be cooked and enjoyed on the spot. Nothing beats a Saturday afternoon spent sitting quayside, slurping on freshly shucked oysters.



Middle Harbour Yacht Club

Just seven kilometres outside the centre of Sydney, Middle Harbour Yacht Club feels worlds away from the throng of the city. With its relaxed atmosphere and sunny disposition, it is sure to get anyone into holiday mode—but that doesn’t mean it doesn’t take sailing seriously. Since 1939, the club has been championing local sailing and is now one of the largest in Australia, with alumni regularly winning world-class events such as the Olympics.

One of the highlights of the club is the Harbourview Bar and Bistro, which offers stunning views of the marina. It is the perfect spot for a chill-out lunch or dinner under the stars.

DO

Catch some waves at Bondi

There is a reason that Bondi Beach is still one of the most famous sandy strips in the world, and it has everything to do with its turquoise waters and perfect swell. Giant projections of Sydney's skyline—both current and from as far back as 1788—cover the walls, while a sculpture outside the building depicts the first encounter between the original people of Australia and the officers from the First Fleet. The museum manages to address issues such as colonisation in a sensitive but honest manner, and there is a whole section dedicated to the convicts of yore.

As well as a permanent gallery, the museum has an ever-changing programme of exhibitions that all somehow tie in with Sydney and its history, making it a must-visit for anyone who has ever wanted to understand a little more about this fascinating city.
