Its lush landscape may have formed the backdrop for many a Korean drama, but behind its celebrity status lies an island that has a variety of family-friendly activities for a memorable holiday. Spend a day at Hamdeok Beach and make sandcastles with the little ones as azure waves lap the coast. Then, visit Seongsan Ilchulbong, the island's iconic geological formation the Unesco heritage sight offers an easy hike that will reward you with stunning views of the ocean. Apart from natural wonders, Jeju Island is also home to a selection of theme parks, including Shinhwa Water Park, the largest water park on the island. There are 18 wave pools on-site, fun rides, and a 230m water slide for thrill-seekers of all ages. Round off your Jeju-do escapade with some cultural immersion—Jeju is home to female divers known as haenyo, who dive without breathing apparatuses to harvest shellfish and seaweed. This matriarchal tradition dates all the way back to the 17th century and is an integral part of Jeju culture. You can witness these formidable women dive at various beaches around the island, including Jungmun Saekdal Beach.



PLAY

Planning to make the most of your family holiday to East Asia? Visit Tokyo as well for its springtime blossoms. While you're there, plan visits to the Tokyo American Club (tokyoamericanclub.org), home to a myriad top-of-the-line sports facilities and classes for the young ones. It doubles up as an enriching daycare option for parents who want some alone time.

LUXE LIFE X LUSH ESCAPES

CHIANG MAI, THAILAND

Thailand's largest Northern city may not be as popular a tourist destination as its capital, Bangkok, or its idyllic Phuket, but the road less trodden is paved with enriching activities for a family adventure. Journey back in time as you walk through the Old City, an enclave where history and culture meet. There are museums, restaurants, a famous street market, and temples galore—Chiang Mai, in fact, has over 300 temples across its length. The Elephant Nature Park is a must-visit. Located an hour's drive north from the main city, guests get to feed, play, and care for the rescue elephants at this sanctuary. Doi Inthanon National Park is another one of Chiang Mai's sublime sights, and it's well worth setting aside a full day to visit. Located up in the mountains, the park has an 80m-high waterfall, and a summit that's the highest point in all of Thailand. Drive up to the peak and marvel at how cold the temperatures can get, even in the midst of summer.



NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand is often dubbed one of the best family-friendly destinations in the world, thanks to its varied landscapes, which offers tourists a slew of natural activities across its two major islands. If you're travelling with children, it's hard to go wrong with a road trip through the country's North Island. Visit Waitomo Caves, where limestone caves are constellated with glowworms; Waikato countryside, of *Lord of the Rings* fame; and Rotorua, where thermal springs and immersive experiences of Maori culture await—great places to tick off your bucket list. Each of these spots are bound to wow visitors young and old.

Planning a trip to South Island too? Then make your way to Milford Sound. Named New Zealand's most spectacular wonder, the fjord is nature at its most pristine. Day cruises are available to see it from the sea, but if you're keen on water activities, then book a kayaking or sailing trip for you and the family.

Visiting New Zealand by the way of Australia? Then make sure to pay a visit to the Royal Motor Yacht Club (royalmotor.com.au) in Sydney for some R&R. The club has a world-class marina on-site, and family-friendly restaurants serving up premium seafood.





Start your spring on a high note by booking a pastoral getaway for you and your family to the Welsh farmlands. A farm-stay holiday is an excellent way to immerse yourself in the scenic Welsh countryside and enjoy an urban detox, with the option of kid-friendly activities right outside your doorstep. The Werngochlyn Farm near Abergavenny, for example, allows its guests to live in a 12th-century stone farmhouse ring-fenced by picturesque, green fields. On the farm are miniature pigs, horses, and a variety of other farm animals that the family can opt to care for during their stay. You also have the option of collecting eggs from the hens each day for breakfast. Those inclined towards a fairytale cottage vision of a countryside vacation won't be disappointed with what Wales has to offer either. There are luxurious, private properties like Werganrose Farm, set in Gower Peninsula, with its own private jetty, carp-filled lake, and 35 acres of meadowlands to pass the time hiking, foraging or simply basking under the open, powder-blue sky.




LANZAROTE, CANARY ISLANDS

The easternmost island in the Canary Islands archipelago boasts a cool, sunny climate yearround, coastal views, relaxed resorts, and aweinspiring volcanic landscapes—a no-brainer for family vacations. Timanfaya National Park is essential viewing if you're on the island. Instead of lush greenery, the national park is home to sprawling, geologic formations and dunes, as well as an active geyser that still spurts both water and steam. If you're keen to see the park with new perspective, why not book the family a camel-ride tour? The all-ages activity lets adults and children ride camels through the Luna route of the national park, with breaks for geyser demonstrations along the way. For avid swimmers and scuba divers, Lanzarote has plenty to offer, including outdoor swimming pools and an underwater museum accessible only by diving. So

FAST AND FEARLESS

CONSUMMATE BUSINESSMAN NICHOLAS COCKS' SECRET TO AN EVENTFUL LIFE? NEVER BACKING OUT FROM NEW VENTURES AND ADVENTURES.

e is the Founder and Director of a concrete company;
Managing Partner at a venture capital firm, CEO of
a family office that he runs with his brother; and is on
the board of a food-waste technology company. He is
also an avid sailor—in October 2022, he completed
his four-year term as the President of Singapore SB20 Association, but
remains active in the organisation. The SB20 is the largest fleet of onedesign class of racing sailboats in Singapore.

All of the above are part of a typical day for Nicholas Cocks (Nick). "I like to pack my diary out," he laughs.

The day of the interview is no different. It's past 4.30pm as we sit down for a chat, but he looks like his day has just started.

Nick is the quintessential multi-hyphenate, and he clearly revels in every moment of it.

SERENDIPITY AT WORK

Nick was born in Adelaide, Australia, where his father owned a concrete business. A Chartered Accountant by qualification, Nick, however, saw himself more in a corporate setup.

and Singapore Sailing Federation, won the bid to host the SB20 World Championships. However, COVID-19 put a dampener on the event—it is now slated for 2025—but Singapore had secured its place on the global sailing map as the first in Asia to host the world championships.

"My biggest passion is to get more youth sailors involved, but we realised that most patiental level sailors do not pursue the sport.

"My biggest passion is to get more youth sailors involved, but we realised that most national level sailors do not pursue the sport beyond school," says Nick. "What we want is for sailing to become a lifelong passion because it's a sport that has that capacity. We figured that the SB20 was a great class to allow that progression to continue."

So SSBA under Nick's leadership approached educational institutions such as National University of Singapore, Singapore Polytechnic and Singapore Management University and convinced them to buy boats.

Nick is hopeful that the increased interest in their classes will urge students to continue sailing even when they finish their studies.

Nick's wife Stephanie Besse, General Manager at Skyline Luge Sentosa, is an avid sailor as well. "But she's not into racing," he is quick to add. "It gets a bit stressful—a bit like a husband and wife navigating in a car. It's fertile ground for spousal disputes," he laughs. But the couple enjoy going out to sea on their boat when in Sydney.

It was when he was backpacking around Indonesia—and evaluating his future—that his opportunity radar fired up. He realised that there was a gap in the market of ready mixed concrete. "It was like a blue ocean. There was just one other company doing what we did, so a huge market was available," explains Nick.

His dad had retired at that stage, but sent Nick some money to start Readymix—and kickstarted his entrepreneurial journey. Nick relocated to Southeast Asia in 1990—first Indonesia, then Vietnam. Singapore, which caught his fancy as he shuttled between the two countries on work, has been his home since 1995.

Although Nick followed in his father's footsteps, the corporate in him dictated the way the company would be run. "My father had the entrepreneurial spark, and he was a great relationship builder. That element of his business practice is something that I have tried to emulate," he says. "But he was more of a free-wheeling entrepreneur. The company we have now is more structured."

Readymix was followed by his family office, ReadyVentures—which invested in early-stage startups—and Velocity Ventures, a venture capital firm focused on tech innovations in the hospitality industry. The co-founding of the latter coincided with the onset of the pandemic. Although their sector of focus took the worst hit, Nick was quick to recognise that such disruptions would bring a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, more innovations, as well as a sea change to the industry. So his partner and he decided to invest in undervalued assets "to support founders who needed help during that very difficult period". It was a masterplan to tap on to a survival instinct that is innate.

USHERING A LIFESTYLE

A keen eye for opportunity seems to underscore everything Nick does.

His tenure as the President of Singapore SB20 Association (SSBA) saw the nation inching closer to its goal to become a yachting destination—a potential that Nick foresaw right from when he started sailing its waters in his SB20 sailboat.

Nick raced as the SSBA President in the last four SB20 Asia Pacific Championships held at ONE°15

INSPIRATION

My wife Stephanie is my biggest inspiration. I admire everything about her—her discipline. commitment to family, calmness and the balance she has in life.

FOOD

When it comes to local food, I am a Nasi Lemak fan. There's this Bamboo Nasi Lemak place right around the corner from my office. I often have to really control my urae to indulae.

BUCKET LIST

Five months before my dad passed, he and I went on a road trip—we drove all the way from Panama City, Panama, to Anchorage, Alaska. We spent a month on the road, together. We laughed, we argued, we closed all the gaps—everything was said. It was unforgettable.

THE FAMILY MAN

Despite packing his day with activities, family time is important to Nick. He carries fond memories of his own childhood with his father. "We were more mates than father and son, we did a lot of stuff together," he recalls. Nick unfortunately lost him to a car accident in 1997, but honours his memory by making sure to slate time to bond with his own children—he has two daughters and a son.

That includes an endearing tradition he has developed with his kids: He plans a solo trip with each of them when they finish school. "My oldest daughter and I climbed Mont Blanc in France. My son is into mountain biking, but unfortunately his trip got deferred due to COVID-19 and National Service, but we went mountain biking in Chiang Mai," he describes. With his other daughter, his youngest, who is just finishing school, he is planning a trip through Northern Italy.

"I have been fortunate to have accumulated many unforgettable memories in my life," says Nick. Going by his energy and verve, there will surely be more.



ujad Yasin walks in with a big friendly smile after having wished everyone in his path a good morning and politely opening doors for people.

"That's my first job of the day. I smile and wish anyone and everyone that I meet a good morning—because when you smile, you feel better, regardless of how your day started," says the Club's Rooms Manager.

Mujad joined the Club in 2022, but his actions stand testament to the rich hospitality experience he has clocked in over three-and-a-half decades of his career in some of the largest local and international hotel brands—and three-quarter of it has been at the Front Office. Maintaining a calm and friendly demeanour has become second nature to him.

FINDING HIS PATH

When he started out, fresh out of National Service, young Mujad found himself at a time when jobs were not easy to come by. His first job was the '80s version of cold-calling—he knocked on the doors of The Paramount Hotel (now Village Hotel, Katong) to look for a job. As luck would have it, they had one opening that required a specific skill and license—as the General Manager's driver. Albeit a discreet job that was unattached to the hotel workings itself, it opened doors for him to other jobs in the hospitality industry. Barely four months in, his boss scoped his interest in exploring a position at the hotel's Front Desk. This was at a time when reception jobs were restricted to a select few, as height and other aspects of one's appearance were part of the considerations, says the petite Mujad.

He joined the team as a night auditor. It was a job that was alien to him—"I learnt from scratch", says Mujad. The potential his first boss saw in him did not go unnoticed, and soon enough Mujad's career started making steady inroads in Front Office operations—transitioning from a Front Office Assistant to Assistant Front Office Manager in a matter of few years and on to more senior positions.

Moving from hotels to a marina such as ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove was tantamount to beginning a new adventure for Mujad. But it didn't take him long to nail the most important aspect of his job—serving Members as opposed to hotel guests. "Members have a different kind of mindset and expectations as they are also stakeholders in the Club," he summarises

succinctly. Although a new concept to him, it set him in the direction he wanted to approach his role and the value he could bring to the Club.

"I have always wanted to grow in my career. Every time I land a new job, I dream of something bigger. But it's also the thrill of a new kind of role, an opportunity to bring along my experience and knowledge to share with my new team members. I love the exchange of thoughts and ideas," he enthuses.

THE RIGHT ATTITUDE

Mujad learnt the ropes of his new environment very quickly, thanks to his ever-obliging peers and team members.

It didn't take him long to also refine the service standards of the most front-facing office of the Club to not only serve Members better, but also with the view of scaling the business.

"We have specific departments that cater to the different needs of our Members. But as the first point of contact for Members and guests as they walk into the Clubhouse, I strongly believe that we should be able to address any kind of question they may have," says Mujad. Being knowledgeable, polite and courteous, as well as tactful are key, he adds.

This meant that, apart from knowing the rules of the role, he strives for his team to also have a basic knowledge of Membership details, as well as the recreational activities the Club offers.

Taking initiative comes naturally to Mujad. Aside from his customary morning greetings we spoke about earlier, Mujad makes it a point to walk around the Club to ensure the amenities are in order and up to standard. He does this even though it's not part of his job scope.

When asked about job challenges, I expect him to quote handling guests as one, but instead, "learning the Revenue Management System

(RMS) was tough", he says, with a laugh. One of the skills he had to pick up in his new role, Mujad now revels in coming up with innovative ways to boost room revenue during slow periods.

Having been in the industry for many years, one tends to inculcate a solution-based approach with guests, says Mujad. "You get attuned to the needs of others. I try to understand where they are coming from, and their anger and frustration. That gives me an opportunity to make them happier."

For someone who seems to live and breathe his work, Mujad makes sure to leave it behind when he leaves the office. The 58-year-old father of one reserves his deepest thoughts and me-time to sharing life lessons with his 27-year-old son, who is embarking on a successful career of his own. The veritable homebody's evenings are spent with his wife watching whatever show she chooses on Netflix.

These moments are important for me to recharge, says Mujad. And the first thing he does when he gets back to his desk the next day? Open his RMS. ☑

ack in 2018, I remember my entire team feeling a little apprehensive when my professor announced his plans to rebuild coral communities at a recreational marina. The thought of the coral restoration effort being compounded by impacts of coastal recreation, boating activities and boating-related contaminants in the marina raised a few eyebrows in the room—"Can meh?".

For years, my team at the Reef Ecology Laboratory has been racing against time to lend corals a hand in their fight against climate change and coastal development. We have been actively involved in restoring Singapore's degraded coral reefs and creating new reef areas from artificial structures. As further loss of Singapore's reefs is predicted over the next two decades, teaming up with ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove to establish a coral garden under the docks seemed like a perfect opportunity to help give corals a boost and to bring a part of our reefs back to the city.

A week later, we headed to the marina for a dive survey to take stock of its coral population and assess the feasibility of restoration.

Diving off a marina's pontoon was a whole new experience for us. With my left hand on my mask, I tumbled off the edge of the pontoon and floated towards my buddy. I gave my buddy a thumbs-down to signal my intent to start the dive and sank slowly

into the emerald-green waters of the marina. It took me just five seconds to reach the silty seafloor. Looking at my dive compass, we finned slowly towards the artificial seawall structure—the starting point of our coral survey. There, I found myself manoeuvring around long strands of sargassum seaweed and piles of granite rocks, taking photographs and scribbling the names of all the corals in my path. Unlike other natural reefs in Singapore that I have dived in, most of the coral colonies in the marina were fist-sized and sparsely scattered along the seawall.

Some of the corals, however, were massive. For instance, the disk corals were wider than a metre and had ruffles that made them look like cabbages. Just seven minutes into the survey, I was distracted by a tigertail seahorse gently twirling around the base of the seaweed, trying to find its

perfect hiding spot. Three flutter kicks later, a colourchanging cuttlefish laying its eggs within a carnation coral instantly drew my attention away from the corals. I could not help admiring colourful reef fishes zipping around the corals, especially the juvenile parrotfish that were busy nibbling on the boulder corals.

My team nodded in approval as we emerged though the water surface. We were all pleasantly surprised by the diversity of naturally occurring corals thriving in the marina's artificial environment. In just 60 minutes of our dive into the marina's waters, we recorded 153 coral colonies spanning across 26 species. Of which, some of the massive and plate-like hard coral species, such as brain corals, pore corals and flowery disk corals, are also commonly found on Singapore's reefs. The recruitment of various types of coral spats and presence of stable granite rocks

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indicated an ideal environment to create a coral garden within the marina.

From the visual assessment of the marina's marine life and underwater conditions, we devised a plan to transform plots of barren granite rocks into a vibrant coral garden. To rebuild the coral communities in the marina, we employed the coral gardening technique, in which corals are first reared in nurseries before being transplanted back onto the seawalls of the marina. The coral nurseries were specially designed to suit the marina's unique environment. By hanging the coral nurseries along the floating pontoon, the reared corals would be constantly submerged at an optimum depth despite changing tides, and the seabed area can be maximised to populate the marina with more corals. The large base of the coral nurseries created additional space for marine life to colonise. The coral nurseries were also perforated to facilitate good water flow around the structures and reduce sediment accumulation that may smother the corals.

With a green basket looped around my right arm, I went searching for corals that were half-buried in the seabed or stuck in between rock crevices. These were loose corals that had been dislodged from the granite rocks or the parent colonies by wave actions, marine animals or human activities—and would have perished if left on their own. Picking up my hammer and chisel, I carefully fragmented each rescued coral into smaller finger-sized pieces and placed them back into the basket.

Then, we scrutinised each fragment and handpicked suitable ones for nursery rearing.

We assembled the coral fragments in neat rows before securing them with putty-like adhesive on the coral nurseries.


Like weeding a garden, the coral nurseries were maintained regularly by removing overgrown seaweeds around the corals and the structures. In about three to six months, nursery-reared corals that had grown to a palm-size were harvested for outplanting. In a bare spot a few metres away from the coral nurseries, we scrubbed off all algae and sediments on large granite rocks before attaching the corals on them. We have planted over 230 corals of various species and growth forms, populating the marina's coral garden. Following the transplantation, we returned regularly to review and document the corals' growth and survivorship. So far, most of the coral colonies appear healthy. Our transplantation efforts have contributed more than $2m^2$, which is about the size of a super single bed, of live coral area to the marina. That is sizeable considering that corals grow 0.3cm to 2cm a year for massive corals, and up to 10cm a year for branching corals.

During some of our monitoring dives, we have spotted pairs of butterflyfish nibbling on the coral transplants and marine creatures, and seeking refuge among the corals' branching structures. Larger marine animals such as Rafael the hawksbill turtle, otters, groupers and even an eagle ray have also been sighted cruising around or using ONE°15 Marina Coral Garden as a hunting ground. When the tides were low, its newest secret unveils itself. Neat clusters of green-, orange- and bronze-coloured corals form a trail lining the base of the marina's northwestern seawalls, with schools of playful damselfish weaving around.

The findings from our research have also indicated that the coral garden initiative by the marina has the potential to complement other local habitat restoration efforts by researchers and policymakers to safeguard our marine biodiversity.

The upkeep of ONE°15 Marina Coral Garden is currently undertaken by volunteer scientists from Reef Ecology Laboratory and divers from Our Singapore Reefs. Coupled with the marina's commitment in promoting environmental stewardship through its operations and public engagement efforts, we are sure that the coral garden will become a haven for marine life to flourish and thrive.

Braised Sea Cucumber and Fish Maw with Oyster Sauce

I used to help my mum out in the kitchen when I was younger, but I would say I really became more aware of food when I started studying at Cornell University in upstate New York. The food choices were certainly less than in Hong Kong and the only way to get the taste of home was if I cooked it myself. That's when I started learning a lot more about Cantonese cuisine and the history behind some of the dishes.

I left Hong Kong when I was 18 and have not lived at home since—my sister now lives abroad as well. My fondest food memory is linked with times when the family got together and my mum would prepare Braised Sea Cucumber and Fish Maw with Oyster Sauce. The luxurious and delicious treat has become a sign of a good family meal for me.

One quirk that I will always remember is that my mum would add the fish maw only when we are ready to eat, so it doesn't melt into the sauce. As it is very gelatinous and full of collagen, fish maw has a tendency to melt easily (like the collagen soup at hotpot).

I have prepared the dish only once in Singapore. It was on Chinese New Year Eve during the time of COVID-19—I couldn't travel home. Making it and eating it brought back a lot of wonderful memories.

and her kindness and strength—she single-handedly brought up her eight children as my grandfather passed at a young age.

My grandmother was a hawker at West Coast Market, where I used to run around on weekends as a child. She would treat me with such gentleness, and I recall how she would lovingly prepare food for all.

My favourite is the Braised Fresh Bamboo Shoots she makes. The preparation takes about a day because the bamboo shoots have to be thoroughly cleaned and soaked overnight. My grandmother would stew the bamboo shoots for a few hours over gentle fire along with pork belly, fresh whole garlic and soy sauce. The crunchy yet easy-to-chew shoots and the well-stewed sauce combine for a savoury and wholesome flavour. To me, the dish epitomises my grandmother-strong yet gentle, determined yet loving.

My grandmother is 90 years old, but even now she will whip up a whole pot of the dish during festivities, such as Lunar New Year, when the entire family gathers—there are about 35 of us!

This dish has stayed in our family for a very long time, but no-one other than my grandmother knows how to prepare it. My mother never learnt how to make it because the preparation is too tedious and time consuming. My wife and I have made it our resolution to learn how to cook this dish from my grandmother this year.








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SB20 Asian Grand Slam and Asia Pacific Championship
