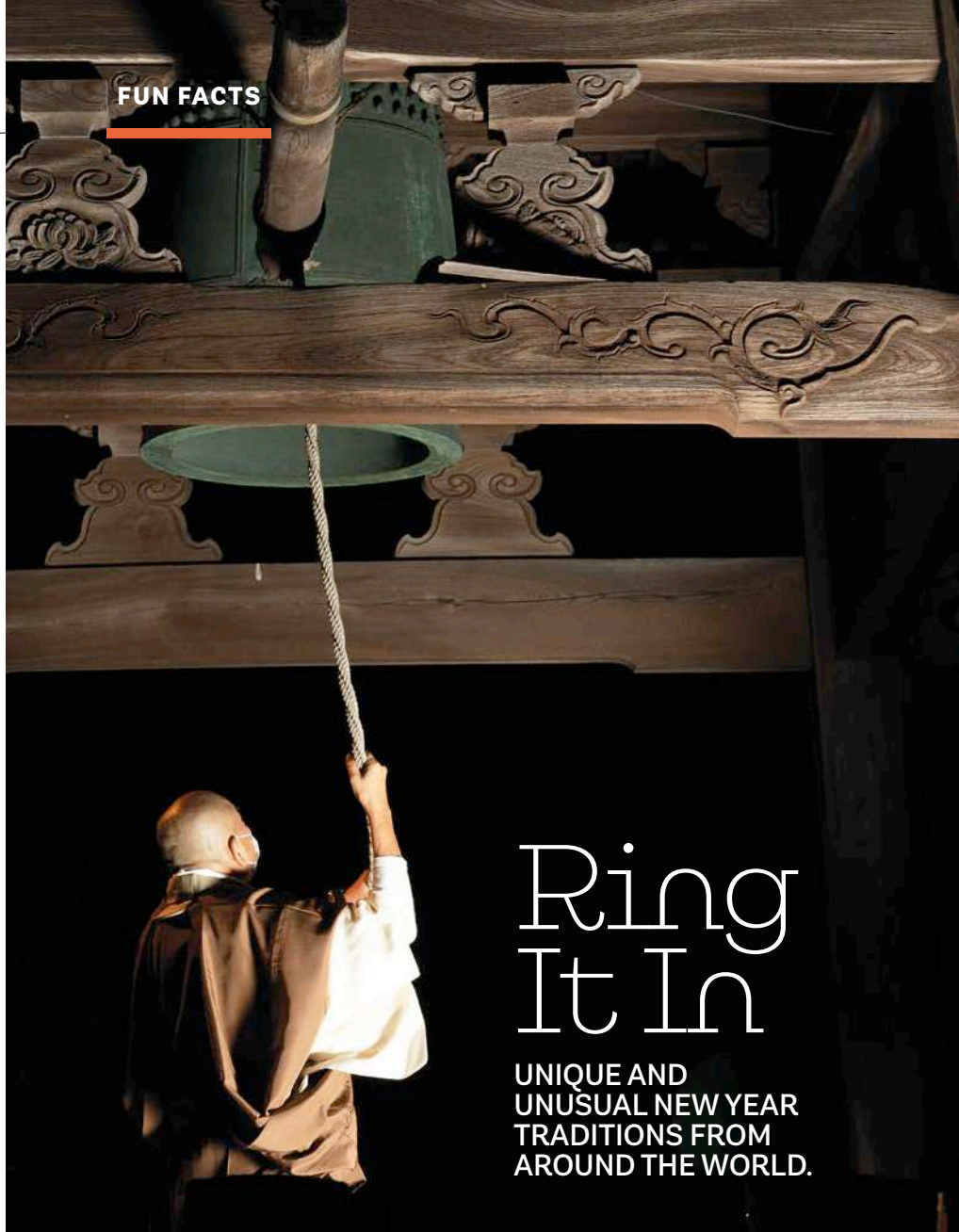

AGITÁGUEDA ART FESTIVAL, PORTUGAL

Portugal is a kaleidoscope of colour and culture any time of the year, but in July, its dynamism reaches a fever pitch thanks to AgitÁgueda Art Festival. Held in Águeda, located between Lisbon and Porto, the festival is held over 20-odd days and is a celebration of local art, artists, music, and Portuguese culture.

The city transforms into a riot of colour that's almost magical during the festival period. One of AgitÁgueda Art Festival's most iconic sights is the Umbrella Sky Project, where thousands of umbrellas are strung across the powerlines that crisscross the downtown area, creating a fantastical ceiling to stroll beneath. Other attractions include the mainstay Carnaval, a block party with live music, urban performance artists, and traditional dance acts. Daily concerts in the city centre are another one of AgitÁgueda's calling cards, and your chance to enjoy native Portuguese acts across a myriad genres. Visit agitagueda.com/en

PLAY

Those sailing into Portugal can dock at the Marina Del Lagos (marinadelagos.pt), one of Portugal's most distinguished yacht clubs, located in the stunning Bay of Lagos.

If you're planning to maximise your visit to Lisse with other regional pitstops, then make London your travel hub. Amsterdam is an hour's flight or train ride away, and while in the English capital, you get to recharge at the iconic Carlton Club (carltonclub.co.uk).

KEUKENHOF FLOWER PARADE, NETHERLANDS

Europe's spring flower festivals are a thing of wonder, but Keukenhof remains a cut above. The Lisse festival, primarily located in the Keukenhof Gardens, is dedicated to celebrating Dutch tulips at their finest. There are over six million tulip bulbs planted across the gardens, creating a veritable rainbow of blossoms that stretch across several English-style gardens. Aside from seeing the blooms within the Garden grounds, the Keukenhof festivities extend to a spring Flower Parade that should be on everyone's bucket list.

Parade floats drive down from Noordwijk into the Keukenhof Boulevard. Each float features a colourful, larger-than-life showpiece crafted with spring blossoms ranging from hyacinths to tulips. Previous years have seen Vincent van Gogh, mythical creatures and cars, crafted entirely out of these seasonal blooms. While the parade is Lisse's main springtime attraction, there's plenty more to see around the quaint Dutch town. For one, it's known as the Flower Town of the Netherlands, so you'll be able to shop for rare seeds and blooms you can bring home to hone your green thumb. The Keukenhof Castle is another must—the 17th-century mansion is home to stunning garden grounds and restored palatial rooms rife with fairytale whimsy. Visit tulipfestivalamsterdam.com

SAPPORO YUKI MATSURI, JAPAN

If you've planned a ski trip to Sapporo next February, be sure to pencil in some time to experience the Sapporo Yuki Matsuri festival. Typically held on the first week of the month, this is one of Japan's most popular wintertime celebrations. This festival also features the most awe-inspiring ice and snow sculptures, some of which can be as high as 15m, and are quite the spectacle.

The festival is held across three sites, all accessible via the subway. Odori Site is the main attraction—the 1.5km long stretch is lined with painstakingly crafted, life-sized snow sculptures, which are lit up until 10pm. While the giant sculptures are what you head to Odori for, stay and marvel at the hundreds of smaller ones as well. Susukino Site is the next spot that focuses on smaller ice sculptures. Housed within Sapporo's main entertainment district, there are plenty of bars and restaurants around the area offering you shelter from the cold. Those travelling with kids should make the trek to the Tsudome Site, where a giant snow slide feature has been formed out of ice. You can take rides here, or stay to watch performances from local artists at the nearby pavilion. Visit snowfes.com/en/

Make the most out of your time in Japan with a pitstop in Tokyo. A visit to Roppongi Hills Club (roppongihillsclub.com), which offers skyscraping views of the city and stellar dining establishments, should be on the list.





YI PENG LANTERN FESTIVAL, THAILAND

Chiang Mai's ethereal Yi Peng Lantern Festival offers a sight straight out of a Studio Ghibli movie. Celebrated during a full moon night on the twelfth month of the lunar calendar—which often falls in November—Yi Peng transforms the entire city into a vibrant spectacle of lights, music, and bustle. The main attraction is the lantern release event, where thousands of paper khom loy (lanterns) ascend to the skies as an offering for good luck and fortune in the next year. This tradition has origins rooted in Thailand's Lan Na Kingdom, which ruled from the 13th to 18th centuries.

During Yi Peng, Chiang Mai's three historic landmarks—the Old Town, Tha Pae Gate, and Three Kings Monument—will become sites for cultural events, each offering visitors something a little different. At the Old Town's moat, you'll witness picturesque krathong (a small vessel or basket) flower lantern offerings floating into the river. Stay at the Old Town and immerse yourself in parade showcases, with traditional Thai dancers, live music, and fire displays. Both Tha Pae Gate and the Three Kings Monument will be bathed in candlelight with lanterns crafted by locals. To seek respite from the bustle, swing by one of the Old Town's rooftop bars to catch the festivities from above. Visit yipenglanternfestival.in.th

PLAY

A trip to Thailand is not complete without a pitstop in Bangkok. While there, enjoy a bit of R&R at Pacific City Club (pacificcityclub.com), a members-only enclave in the city centre.

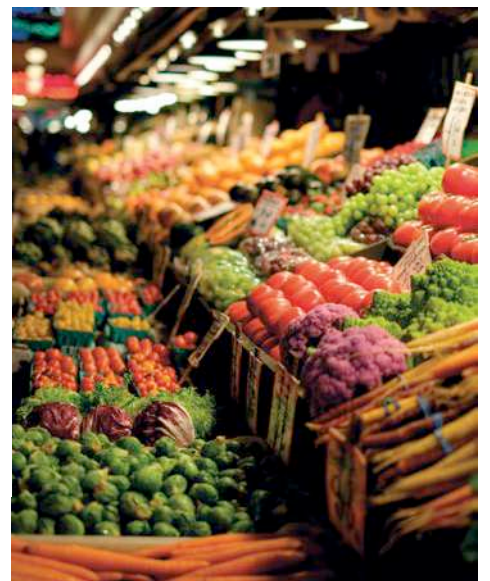
TRØNDELAG FOOD FESTIVAL, NORWAY

Trondheim isn't the first city you'd think of when seeking out a food-focused holiday in Northern Europe, but the Trøndelag Food Festival will change your mind. For three days in August, the gorgeous city of Trondheim proves why it is one of the continent's up-and-coming culinary destinations.

The event typically sees 250,000 visitors who flock to the city just to shop from the 200-odd Norwegian producers who've set up shop, hawking everything from local seafood and beer, to cheese and chocolate. During the festival, keen cooks, young and old, can sign up for masterclasses to learn from popular chefs, and pick up traditional culinary methods you'd be hard-pressed to learn elsewhere. These include local fermentation secrets, seafood preparation techniques, and tutorials to better food sustainability at home. Gastronomes whose idea of a good time would be to let someone else handle the cooking will find that the festival has just as much to offer. Local chefs typically set up kiosks and offer chef's table dinners that you can reserve in advance, and enjoy special, festival-exclusive menus designed around local produce. Many of these events take place in and around historic Trondheim landmarks, so you'll be able to feast and sightsee, hitting two birds with one stone. You'll likely have to fly into Stockholm to get to Trondheim. Stretch out your layover into a mini Swedish holiday and spend some time at the world-leading Royal Swedish Yacht Club (kss.se).



NEED FOR SPEED

THE STORY OF BOAT TOURS COMPANY RHIB RIDES SINGAPORE'S IS ABOUT A FATHER AND DAUGHTER'S LOVE FOR THE WATER AND UNIQUE EXPERIENCES.

Picture yourself right at the front of an open boat, facing the sea and being one with the water—sometimes cutting through the waves, sometimes gently gliding on them. This exhilarating experience, that is a heady mix of speed, agility and the dynamic nature of water itself, is something you would encounter with RHIB Rides Singapore, the brainchild of father-daughter duo Roy and Ariel Soeigiarto. The company is the first of its kind to offer tours using RHIBs (rigid hull inflatable boats) that are tropicalised for Asian use, with foam tubes, and are built to specifications by Kairos Boats.

“But safety first, always,” quips Ariel. These were the words her father had always insisted on from when she was a child when he used to take her and her three younger siblings out to sea. The 23-year-old holds a diploma in UX design from Republic Polytechnic—“I graduated during lockdown, so all I got was a letter in the mail,” she laughs. Ariel is also a speedboat racer, and the only one to also be PPDCL certified—which is a mandatory requirement unique to Singapore.

A passionate boater and an exclusive distributor of specialised water crafts, Roy also owns a fleet of boats that offer safety and security services for events and runs educational programmes.

RHIB Rides Singapore, which was launched in 2019, is a celebration of their combined love for the water and exploration, as Ariel explains. Here, she shares about herself, her company and her experience working with her dad.



Where does your attraction to the water come from?

It's because of my dad—he would always take me and my siblings out boating as kids. We would go out to Nongsa in Batam or sometimes all the way up to Tioman, and spend the day snorkelling and having a barbecue by the water. I feel very old when I say this, but I have actually seen how Lazarus and St John's Islands changed and developed over the years.

Tell us how the idea to start RHIB Rides Singapore came about.

I had been working part time with my dad's company, prior to my diploma, doing security for events. During that time, we did bring in new boats and even those designed specifically for touring—for the benefit of VIPs or guests who would come on board. So we thought, why don't we take this concept and make it into tourism?

The idea was to also bring more awareness about Singapore waters. I realised through conversations with friends and others

that many Singaporeans do not know about The Southern Islands or the history behind them. Some of them even don't know about Fort Siloso on Sentosa Island—although Covid-19 brought more awareness. So it was a mix of all these factors. We are not competing with yacht charters or other luxury services. We think of ourselves as a good appetiser—we just want to introduce people to Singapore waters. If they want to take it forward to the main course, we can connect them with the right resources.

Were there any initial challenges?

Right about the time we started, lockdown happened, but it was not a challenge for us, to be honest. In a way it gave us more time to plan and refine our standard operating procedures. When the lockdown lifted, but with border closures still in place, many locals came on our tours—it was something new that people were keen on trying. Singapore Tourism Board's Singapore Rediscover Vouchers also helped speed it along. We were able to take all their feedback and tailor the experience further.

How do you balance safety with the excitement of being on a RHIB?

To give you a bit of an idea of RHIBs, they are very different from other kinds of inflatable boats. They have two tubes at the side that help balance the boat. They are also positioned such that the water splashes away from the boat rather than in, so you can stay dry—unless the captain wants you to get wet. The ride is not like a rollercoaster, it is a set speed and something we can control.

When we started, we had one 10-seater boat, and now we have expanded our fleet to four of various sizes and configurations to suit people of all ages and demographics. We are also able to customise the seating arrangements to varied preferences and comfort levels.

These are things we actually tried out ourselves, to determine which part of the boat is the most comfortable or stable or where's the most exciting. I did a lot of testing on the boat myself. We would take the boat out and I would pretend I was "user A" (honing in on my training in UX design), and if this was my first experience on a boat or I had a fear for water, which part of the boat would be the most comfortable for me.

We also replaced the original seat belts the boats came with, which were like the ones on commercial aeroplanes. We tested the seatbelts on my

sibling—she was 10 years old then—and the first thing she did when she got in was to unclasp the seatbelt. Our new lap belts are reinforced with velcro and children cannot remove them by themselves. Wearing a lifejacket and keeping the lap belt on are mandatory aboard our boats.

What else makes the RHIB Rides Singapore experience different from the rest?

One of the things that we really wanted to incorporate into our rides was curation. My dad has some deejaying experience, so our boats are fitted with a sound and mic system, which we are able to control from the captain's console at the back of the boat. Our playlist has also grown as we cater to our guests' preferences. Many of them share with us the memories and emotions that certain tunes or songs stir in them and we try to recreate those moments during our rides. We have guests from different countries, so music plays a big part in the experience.

Our guests also get other kinds of knowledge such as the dangers involved in the waters. Many jet skiers and boats try to go under the tunnel that connects St John's and Lazarus Islands—where the current is very high, there are also many fishing lines hanging from above. Sometimes during our rides, we have had to rescue boaters who have capsized. We always inform our guests about what we are about to do and urge them to just observe and not record or document the incidents on their phones or other devices. It's a different kind of learning experience for them.

How inclusive are your rides for differently-abled people?

We have had instances when some guests are on wheelchairs. So that's why our latest boats are designed to be at the hip level, which means that people with mobility issues do not have to climb into the boat and put unnecessary stress on their legs and knees or have to be carried in by someone. They can sit down and just slide into the boat. They can do the same when they go back up onto the jetty as well.

How has working with your father been?

At the beginning, it was quite difficult. I am a very headstrong person—I actually get that trait from my dad [laughs]. So there were a few clashes, but in the end we realised that we both wanted the same things. Over the course of time, we have learnt to communicate better. Now, we don't even have to use words, through just a nod or a gesture, my dad gets what I am trying to say.

Any unforgettable experiences?

There have been many, but one incident keeps coming back to me. My dad and I are usually at the back of the boat so we can watch over our guests. I am usually a silent photo- and videographer. There was once when a father had come with his very young daughter. It was so wonderful watching how he was indulging her and making sure she was enjoying the ride—it brought back memories of my time with my dad as a child. I still look at the photograph and think back on the days he and I used to have disagreements. It brings tears to my eyes—we have come a long way. 📷

Aside from a prize money, the winners received support in the form of networking and collaboration opportunities to catalyse their impact.

All 10 finalists were equal contenders and with one goal: To save the oceans, conserve the marine environment, and in turn, the coastal communities it supports. Foremost on their minds was the comforting thought that they were not alone and were part of a community of like-minded and goal-oriented individuals.

The awards are part of Blue Water EduFest, which was conceived with the objective to raise awareness about climate change and advance action. The event aims to bring together conservationists, environmental experts and key stakeholders united in the cause to keep our waters clean and find solutions for a sustainable future.

THE LEGACY CONTINUES

Blue Water EduFest is back, continuing its mission, which—as shared by Arthur Tay, CEO and Chairman of SUTL Group of Companies—is to garner support and advance the “Blue Water movement” across Southeast Asia through collaborations with governments and industry partners in the region. “By embracing the mindset of ‘leaving it to others’, we can never be a catalyst for change,” he added.

The three-day non-profit event will be held from 2 to 4 November 2023 at ONE°15 Marina Sentosa Cove Singapore. It includes The

Ocean Collective Summit—a solutions-based conference—the awards ceremony of Blue Water Heroes 2023, and a beach and marina cleanup.

The Ocean Collective Summit, held in collaboration with International SeaKeepers Society Asia, will be on 2 and 3 November. Acclaimed oceanographer and environmentalist Fabien Cousteau returns as the lead speaker. There will also be talks and panel discussions on blue finance, eco-tourism, and ocean technology and governance. Last year's winners will present their personal conservation journeys at the summit and highlight how their creative solutions have influenced positive action.

BLUE WATER HEROES AWARDS 2023

For this edition as well, 10 eco-champions were shortlisted as finalists from the nominations received from around the region. They participated in a Pitch Presentation—a new addition to the selection process this year—on 10 October.

The finalists showcased their organisation's vision, scalable impact and future plans before a distinguished panel of judges, which included Arthur Tay, as well as other experts, academics and executives in charge of implementing sustainability strategies.

They were Dr Toh Tai Chong, Senior Lecturer, National University of Singapore; Janet Shum, Sustainable Investing Specialist, APAC, Citi Global Wealth; Dr Winston Chow, Associate Professor of Urban Climate, Singapore Management University; Christine Amour-Levar, Founder & CEO of HER Planet Earth and Co-founder, Investors for Climate; Paul Foster, entertainment personality and environmentalist; and Chong Seow Wei, Regional Senior Editor, Tatler Gen.T.

The awards ceremony of Blue Water Heroes will be held as a Gala Dinner event on 3 November. The sustainable dining experience will include a video showcase of the 10 finalists, unveiling how their innovative initiatives that are reshaping the world of marine conservation and driving positive impact. Three of them will be announced as winners of Blue Water Heroes Awards.

Television host, presenter and sustainability advocate Melissa Tan will lead the awards night as the emcee. There will also be a live band, a welcome video by Dr Sylvia Earle, presentations by youth members of the Ocean Geographic Antarctic Climate Expedition 2023, and a piano performance by 12-year-old Hillary O'Sullivan, who was among the 12 Singaporeans selected for the expedition. A live auction featuring exclusive memorabilia and other unique items will complete the evening.

Blue Water EduFest will conclude with a beach and marina cleanup on 4 November.

WATER WORLD

MARINA OPERATIONS MANAGER TASRIN TOMING IS DRIVEN BY A LOVE FOR HIS JOB AND SENSE OF PURPOSE.

It's past the breakfast rush at LATITUDE Bistro as I sit down with Tasrin Toming, the Club's Marina Operations Manager. He slots in a few friendly waves and even stops by a Member's table to have a few words as he makes his way to our table.

Tasrin has been with the Club for about five years, so it doesn't come as a surprise that he is a familiar figure for most Members, especially boat owners. But from the way he ensures I am comfortable and being attended to by the restaurant's friendly staff, it is clear that leading with "let me know how I can help you" comes naturally to him.

BORN FOR THE SEA

Today, after a career span of 30 years, the marina world is where Tasrin is in his element. However, it's not something he'd dreamed of doing as a child. He was introduced to the industry when he was assigned Coast Guard duty during his National Service.

Intrigued and raring to explore more, he joined Raffles Marina—starting at the bottom and working his way up. In the 23 years he spent there, he learnt all there was to know about boats, the docks as well as leading convoys and coordinating boat shows. A three-year stint at Republic of Singapore Yacht Club gave him insight into managing a marina reconfiguration. Tasrin is also a certified PPCDL trainer.

Despite his years of experience, when the opportunity to work at ONE°15 Marina came up, Tasrin confesses to feeling intimidated—"because of the high level of prestige it holds in the industry". "I didn't think I was capable enough to handle the distinguished clientele," he says humbly.

His fears were unfounded—Members, in fact, appreciate the breadth of his technical knowledge.

"That's the advantage of learning from scratch. I am able to address all kinds of issues that boaters may have," he says, adding that having a sound knowledge of the workings of the marina as well as that of different kinds of boats was expected. In return, working in a place that sees the best and the latest superyachts has helped keep him on his toes and his knowledge updated.

PEOPLE-CENTRIC APPROACH

Aside from managing the day-to-day operations of the marina, Tasrin is also hands-on in coordinating yacht charters and international boating events.

Key to all this is building good relationships with all involved—from the yacht crew to the captains to the owners themselves. Tasrin is always on hand offering advice and extending his service, be it organising choice berthing and mooring options for the yachts or

suggesting entertainment options for their owners' exclusive guests.

He also manages the intricate balance between customer relations and compliance without compromising on experience. "Being a marina, we have to be mindful of government and maritime regulations when handling our boaters' requests. It is my job to work out various options, so we can all come to an amicable compromise," he says.

Some situations can be trickier than others, but he remains unfazed and refrains from even referring to them as challenges. "I believe that any issue can be resolved if you can sit down and discuss the many viable options available. It's about the relationship—they know you, so they trust you and listen to you," he says. "I feel lucky to have this chance to meet people from such varied backgrounds and be able to help them."

TASRIN'S TOP 3

FOOD

Every morning, before coming to work, I drive to Seah Im Food Centre at HarbourFront to have thosai (Indian crispy pancake) with egg. It's my favourite way to start the day.

UNWIND

Through the week, I watch Members and others relaxing and enjoying the day, and I do my best to make them feel comfortable. On my off days, it's my turn, and I always go to the beach. I love to just lay there, listen to music and relax.

HOLIDAY

Any place by the water. But I am not a fan of long breaks. I get restless beyond three or four days and I will be on my laptop and start working. So I travel around the region.





Having a dedicated and efficient team behind him has been an important part of this process, and he makes sure they always stay on top of things. Tasrin takes it upon himself to train newcomers in the right processes and ensures everyone has the necessary skills to offer the services boaters require—including safely towing the boats when necessary and managing minor crises.

He flags off each day with a briefing on standard operating procedures and a post mortem of events of the previous day, following that with discussions on what can be improved going forward. Key to that morning meeting is making sure that each and every member in his team is also in the right frame of mind. “This job requires one’s complete attention. If I feel that anyone in my team is not up for the day’s challenges—mentally and physically—I prefer that they take a short break and realign themselves than be distracted at work,” he says emphatically.

WORLD-CLASS ENVIRONMENT

Through our conversation, it is quite clear that Tasrin loves what he does. What also stands out is the pride he feels at working in a world-class marina.

“I have visited a few marinas in Singapore, and our neighbours Malaysia, Thailand and Indonesia. The biggest difference is in the top-notch facilities we have. We have every new marina-related technology and amenity in the market—from the power pedestal installed on each berth, to the electrical pumpout boat. “When we installed Collec”Thor, a fixed waste collector, we were the first in Asia to do so,” he says, in almost child-like glee.

“We are also looking at getting power stations for sustainable fuelling options,” he adds. “It’s about the mindset of putting comfort and experience over all.”

Indeed. Tasrin embraces that in his day-to-day life at the marina. He takes pride in his work and is proud about his workplace. 📍
